Notes for users of this Certificate

The **Summary of attainment** section lists all the Group Awards, Courses and stand-alone Units that the candidate has achieved since 1994. Certificate holders can obtain information about earlier attainments by contacting SQA.

The **Detailed record of attainment** section lists all the Group Awards, Courses and Units the candidate has achieved since last issued with a certificate.

The **Profiles** section shows the candidate's current achievements in Core Skills and SCQF credits.

- ◆ Core Skills are the five skills that are important for work. They are often achieved automatically, being embedded in other qualifications. The highest possible level for a Core Skill is 6.
- ◆ The SCQF is a way of describing and comparing Scottish qualifications. It links with other frameworks in the UK and Europe. It describes a qualification by giving it a level to show how hard it is, and a number of credit points to show how much work is involved. There are 12 levels, level 1 being the simplest and level 12 the most complex. One credit point represents approximately 10 hours of effort.
